- Parent College and Career Academy Series of workshops to inform parents about career pathways and post-secondary routes and opportunities for students. Translation service will be available.
- At DELAC and SSC meetings, school members share activities happening at our school sites. During this
  time, our educational partners are hearing how the school is supporting our students to improve academic
  achievement and school performance.

OFY-Acton integrates parent and family engagement strategies throughout the school year by planning and advertising events our educational partners would be interested in attending.
